## Planned Gifts are a Blessing

### A Word from Our Executive Director

Over the next few years, our work is going to matter more than ever.

Regardless of what the law might be, we will work hard to save babies, offer compassion, hope and help...changing families with the gospel one individual at a time! We are growing because our services are more needed than ever impacting the sanctity of life in the northeast plains!

It has been our desire to expand our Brush office since I arrived in 2022, adding dedicated ultrasound space, additional advocacy space, several offices, storage and a one car garage to house our donated company car. The question was how to fund it. We took it to the Lord, and **He has blessed us with a legacy donation large enough to pay cash for our expansion.** To say the least, we were stunned!

I asked myself, what have I done to encourage planned gifts? The answer was little to nothing. Each of us has the opportunity to change the face of the agencies we support with a final contribution. There comes a time when you realize the brevity of life and begin to ponder what kind of legacy you want to leave behind. How can you impact lives for generations to come? Make a bequest in your will. It's by far the simplest way.

Interestingly enough, over 60% of people in Colorado over 18 do not have a will. If you don't have one, it's as easy as going to **freewill.com** and filling in the blanks. Instead of the state deciding where your assets go, take a moment to make a simple will. If your estate is larger, seek the advice of an estate planner or attorney. Nevertheless, a simple will is better than no will.

There are several ways to impact the agencies you want to support. You can: 1) make a will bequest, 2) make a gift of stock, securities or appreciated properties, 3) make a gift of a life insurance policy or beneficiary designation. In addition to these three, there are other more complicated ways to give. Most people identify the top three non-profits that they support and leave a measure of their estate to them. We hope you'd choose us as one of those organizations. In the case of our recent donation, we were left the entirety of her estate upon her passing. What an incredible blessing and answer to prayer! And wouldn't you know it was exactly what we needed. God works that way! His timing is perfect!

We are so very thankful for the contributions of our supporters across the northeast plains. Because of your support, we assist literally hundreds of individuals to preserve life and become successful family units. I'm asked frequently if we'll be put out of business.
